Dear Parents, Staff and Children,

A big welcome back to everyone as we enter the Summer Term. I hope you all had a lovely Easter holiday, got plenty of rest and were able to spend quality time with friends and family.

As we are now in the Summer Term a quick reminder that children should now be wearing Summer Uniform and must make sure that they have a water bottle with them every day. As the weather improves the children may require a sunhat and sun cream. Sun cream can be sent into school with your child but must have your child's name written on it and it will be your child's responsibility to apply it. Staff are not able to apply sun cream for individual children.

As the Summer term has now started it is that time of year where Year six children are allowed, with permission from their parents, to walk to and from school on their own. All permission from parents must be put in writing and state the days your child will be walking home. If your child has an After School Club, then Parents must collect their children from these. This will start from Tuesday 3rd May.



PRIVATES ARE PRIVATE

Your underwear covers up your private parts and no one should ask to see or touch them. Sometimes a doctor, nurse or family members might have to. But they should always explain why, and ask you if it's OK first. Remember, what's in your pants belongs only to you.



You always have the right to say 'no' –
even to a family member or someone you
love. You're in control of your body and the
most important thing is how YOU feel. If
you want to say 'No', it's your choice.

S PEAK UP, SOMEONE CAN HELP

It's always good to talk about stuff that makes you upset. If you're worried, go and tell a grown up you trust - like a family member, teacher or one of your friend's parents. They'll say well done for speaking out and help make everything OK. You can also call Childline on 0800 1111 and someone will always be there to listen.

A LWAYS REMEMBER YOUR BODY BELONGS TO YOU

No one should ever make you do things that make you feel embarrassed or uncomfortable. If someone asks to see or tries to touch you underneath your underwear say 'NO' – and tell someone you trust and like to speak to.



ALK ABOUT SECRETS THAT UPSET YOU

There are good secrets and bad secrets. If a secret makes you feel sad or worried, it's bad – and you should tell an adult you trust about it straight away.
